Theme for Next Weekends Readings

The early Christians were aware of the uniqueness of the Gospel and the new converts accepted it in its entirety. So, when Philip, the deacon, brought the Gospel to the people in Samaria, they accepted it.

We too must be faithful to the full Gospel.

First Reading: The fact that Philip went to a Samaritan town instead of the country districts of Judea, or to Galilee, and that the people there welcomed him implied that Jesus ministered there. Though Jews and Samaritans hated each other, the fact that Jesus ministered to them shows that he was tolerant and inclusive.

Second Reading: The reason for our Christian hope is that it gives us the promise of eternal happiness if we live by Gospel values, and in our suffering, it will help us to draw strength from the fact that Christ has suffered for our salvation.

Gospel: The Advocate enables us to view things clearly and objectively. When we feel overconfident that our opinion is absolutely correct, the Advocate enable sus to consider the case impartially and realise that there are two sides to every story and being overconfident is unreasonable.
