How has Covid affected you?

At next weekend's Masses, Eimear Roche will come to speak to us about the effect which Covid 19 has had on our Mental Health.

Eimear is a qualified and accredited therapist with the Irish Association of Counsellors and Psychotherapists and offers her services through Tríonóide Therapy a low-cost counselling service set up and run by Eimear since 2020.

Low cost private and confidential counselling sessions are offered both on a 1:1 basis and online locally in Rathdowney.

Over the last year the COVID 19 pandemic has led to our resilience being challenged in many ways. Some of the reason people come for counselling support relate to, anxiety, depression, grief/loss, bereavement, stress/burnout, relationship difficulties, early childhood trauma and abuse, loneliness.

Counselling will help you to discover new ways of coping, making changes and developing new skills, finding what works for you.

The main aim of a counsellor is to help you to work through various issues so that you can cope with your problems better.
